The purpose of this circular is to inform members of the "<u>Strengthening Traffic Enforcement,</u> <u>Education, and Responsibility (STEER) Act of 2024</u>," which was enacted to address dangerous driving behavior and reduce speeding and reckless driving in the District of Columbia.

Members shall be aware of the following relevant changes made by the Act that become effective on October 1:

AMENDS RECKLESS DRIVING AND AGGRAVATED RECKLESS DRIVING

Need to Know

Changes the definition to specify that driving 20 miles per hour (mph) in excess of the speed limit qualifies as reckless driving.

Reduces the penalty for a second conviction.

Offense

Reckless Driving

If a person drives a motor vehicle on any highway:

- 20 mph over the speed limit; or
- In any other manner that displays conscious disregard of the risk
 of causing property damage or bodily injury to any person. A
 person shall be guilty of reckless driving if the person drives a
 vehicle upon a highway carelessly and heedlessly in willful or
 wanton disregard for the rights or safety of others, or without due
 caution and circumspection and at a speed or in a manner so as to
 endanger or be likely to endanger a person or property.

Penalty

Need to Know	Aggravated Reckless Driving Establishes that a driver can be charged with aggravated reckless driving if they are driving 20 mph or more over the speed limit if other conditions apply.		
	Increases the penalty for three or more	convictions within a 2-year period.	
Offense	 If a person drives a motor vehicle on any highway: 30 mph or more over speed limit; or 20 mph or more over speed limit, and: (A) Causes bodily harm or permanent disability or disfigurement injury to any other person; (B) Collides with another motor vehicle; or (C) Causes in excess of \$1,000 or more in property damage
