## **DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA**

The purpose of this executive order is to amend Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) procedures regarding cooperation with federal immigration enforcement agencies.

- A. Effective immediately, members may assist federal immigration enforcement agencies with the following:
  - 1. Sharing information about persons **not** in MPD custody (e.g., during traffic stops).
  - 2. Providing transportation for federal immigration agency employees and detained subjects.
- B. Pursuant to <u>GO-PER-201.26 (Code of Conduct)</u>, members <u>shall not</u> make any inquiry through any database solely for the purpose of inquiring about an individual's immigration status. Members <u>shall not</u> make inquiries into any person's immigration status for the purpose of determining whether they have violated the civil immigration laws or for the purpose of enforcing civil immigration laws.
- C. Members **shall not** arrest individuals based solely on federal immigration warrants or detainers as long as there is no additional criminal warrant or underlying offense for which the individual is subject to arrest. Members receiving a hit for a federal immigration warrant or detainer in NCIC shall contact the Teletype Unit pursuant to GO-PCA-702.01 (Arrest Warrants).
- D. Pursuant to <u>DC Official Code § 24–211.07 (Prohibition on cooperation with federal immigration agencies)</u> members **shall not**:
  - 1. Provide to a federal immigration enforcement agency, for an individual in MPD custody, their date and time of release, location, address, personal identifying information, medical information, photograph, or criminal case information.
  - 2. Permit persons in MPD custody to be questioned by federal immigration enforcement agency employees.
  - 3. Hold an individual in MPD custody after that individual would have been otherwise released at the request of a federal immigration enforcement agency.

To the extent that provisions in this executive order conflict with existing directives, the provisions set forth in this executive order shall prevail.
